Discarding losers

• Extra winners

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Here is a reminder of how to do it in case you have forgotten.

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- 5. Look at the next suit and repeat steps 2-4.

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The **•**K is an extra winner because **c** in **•** is only 1...

the \clubsuit A is being used to cover the \clubsuit 6;

then, there are no more \blacklozenge in the base hand, so the \diamondsuit K is available to provide a discard.

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Discarding the \clubsuit 2 on the \clubsuit K reduces c in \clubsuit from 3 to 2.

So now, the \clubsuit K loses, then the \clubsuit Q wins and then there are no more \clubsuit in the base hand. \rightarrow 1 loser (when you had 2 initially)

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This time, by discarding the $\stackrel{\clubsuit}{=} 2$ on the $\stackrel{\clubsuit}{=} K$, you are not shortening in the base hand.

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Instead, you enable the third round of the suit to be ruffed in the short hand, which will then get rid of that loser.

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This time, by discarding the $\stackrel{1}{}$ 2 on the $\stackrel{1}{}$ K, you are not shortening in the base hand.

Instead, you enable the third round of the suit to be ruffed in the short hand, which will then get rid of that loser.

When doing this, always check first whether it is safe to draw trumps!

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The K was already available to provide a discard.

• Sometimes, the extra winner(s) you need has/have to be established first.
